Please remember, if your child has suffered from vomiting or diarrhea, NHS guidelines state they must remain off school for **2 days** after symptoms their have gone.

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
Our Week in Pictures!

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Next Half Term....

We are looking forward to seeing you all on Monday 4th November ready for Autumn Term 2. Here's just a few things to look forward to...

This year we are having a different approach to our Annual Book Fair. We have teamed up with Chorleywood Bookshop to put together a recommended reading list for each year group. This has been a joint collaboration between the Sarratt Teaching Team and Mrs Broomfield at the shop, to select quality books and must-reads for the children of Sarratt School. The books selected will form our own bespoke range of fiction and non-fiction texts to buy at the Fair. There will be more information to follow soon.

Leading up to the Fair, which will be held during the week beginning 11th November, Mrs Serby and Mrs O'Hare will be hosting Jackanory Sessions open to both children and adults after school to showcase some of the texts on offer. On Monday 4th November, Mrs Serby will be giving our Key Stage 2 children a sneaky taster to the opening chapter of her chosen novel and Mrs O'Hare will be leading the session for KS1 with one of her favourite picture books. On the following day, Tuesday 5th November, Mrs O'Hare will lead a session for the children and parents in Reception at 3.30pm in the classroom. The sessions should last approximately 15 minutes.

As part of our work in teaching children about British Values, Year 6 will be heading off to The Houses of Parliament on Tuesday 5th November. The class will be setting off nice and early at 7:30am, so please ensure the children are in school for 7:15am (don't forget they will need appropriate outdoor clothing and packed lunches!)
