Pupil Premium Statement 2019-2020

***The school has an inclusive and supportive culture that encourages every pupil and teacher to be the best they can be*" Ofsted December 2015.**

Principles

- We ensure that Teaching and Learning opportunities meet the needs of all pupils
- We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, this includes ensuring that the needs of disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed
- In making provision for disadvantaged pupils, we recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged
- We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals.
- Pupil premium funding will be allocated following a needs analysis which will identify priority areas/individuals/groups.

Provision

- Our work through the pupil premium will be aimed at accelerating progress moving children to attain at least in line with their peers. In order to achieve this, expenditure and provision will be targeted to ensure it addresses social and emotional barriers to learning.

Reporting

- It is the responsibility of the Head of School to produce regular reports for the Governors' on:
 - the progress made towards narrowing the gap, by year group, and individuals for those pupils entitled to the pupil premium
 - an outline of the provision that was made since the last meeting and impact
 - an evaluation of the cost effectiveness, in terms of the progress made by the pupils receiving a particular provision, when compared with other forms of support
- It is the responsibility of the Chairperson to ensure that this information is disseminated to the full governing body
- The Governors & Head of the school will ensure that there is a statement on the school's website to parents and other stakeholders/visitors on how the Pupil Premium funding has been used to

address the issue of 'narrowing the gap', for entitled pupils. This task will be carried out within the requirements published by the Department for Education:

Sarratt C of E Primary School is committed to removing the barriers to learning that our pupils face. For the academic year 2019-2020 we have 10 pupils who are eligible for Pupil Premium funding. Analysis of individual needs has helped to shape our Pupil Premium strategy and inform our classroom practice. This information has also informed the way we will spend our budget.
