We believe that the wearing of a school uniform creates a sense of community identity; it also helps the children focus on their education as soon as they dress for school each day. Our uniform has been chosen for its ease of availability in general high street stores.

Items of clothing that are particular to the school (ie: sweatshirts, fleeces, ties etc.) can be ordered and purchased from our uniform supplier Beat school uniform. Children may also wear jumpers, cardigans and polo shirts without the logo in school colours from general retailers.

Beat School Uniforms also stock optional uniform items such as fleece jackets, raincoats, summer hats and water bottles.

It is vital that each child's clothing is clearly named.

Uniform List

- Green sweatshirt/green fleece/green cardigan/green v-necked pullover
- White polo shirt or shirt and tie*
- Grey skirt or tunic
- Grey trousers/shorts
- Green and white dress (summer)
- Grey/white/black socks
- Green/grey/black tights
- Dark shoes (no heels)
- A seasonally suitable coat.

All pupils – PE/Games

- Plimsolls/trainers
- Training shoes or football boots when appropriate
- Bottle Green shorts (not cycle shorts)
- Bottle Green or Black Skort
- Purple Polo with Sarratt logo (or Plain Dark Purple Polo)
- Bottle Green football socks and shin pads (if appropriate)
- Black tracksuit or leggings for the colder months.

^{*} Students are to wear shirts and ties only in years 5 and 6

Jewellery and Decoration

With the exception of "simple" wrist watches, jewellery should not be worn in school. Hoop earrings and chains are a real danger. Children with pierced ears should wear simple studs. Make up and nail varnish are not permitted.

Hair

Long hair should be tied back for school. Hair decoration must be discrete and in school colours.
